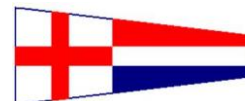


The Treasure Hunt

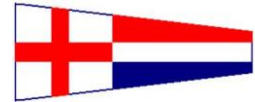
*Our Treasure Hunt goes Round the Bend
